

Help with completing Pastoral Reports

1. Consistent use of terms:

- HSC not Higher School Certificate
- Lasallian Youth Leader not LYL
- House Leader not house leader
- Half Yearly Examinations not half yearly exams
- If you nominate a sport then use capitals in this manner:
 - Opens Green Team (actual name of the team/level)
 - Football, Cricket or Rugby (if just identifying the type of sport)
- Semester One not semester one
- Term 3 not term three
- Use the word 'College' rather than 'school'.

2. Grammar Advice

- Do not use contractions. e.g. 'hasn't' should be 'has not'.
- Abbreviations have no full stop e.g. 'HSC' not 'H.S.C.'
- No comma before the word and in a sentence.
- Write a subject's name in full e.g. Mathematics;
- Write the word examination in full, not exam.
- Tense needs to be consistent. Do not switch from past to present tense within the same sentence.
- Avoid the excessive use of commas. Do not use commas before 'and'.
- Use a comma after the word however in a sentence.
- Longer more complex sentences should be broken into shorter simpler sentences.
